CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

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WHEREAS, Daniel M. St. John, P.E., Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Lake Tahoe through an intake line, pump station and distribution system for Municipal purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 16, T.16N., R.18E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the W $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of said Section 16 bears N. 22° 50' 57" W., a distance of 2,487.93 feet situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Incline Village General Improvement District  
Source: Lake Tahoe (Burnt Cedar)  
Manner of Use: Municipal  
Amount of appropriation: 4.45 c.f.s., but not to exceed 1,250.0 acre-feet annually  
Period of use: January 1st to December 31st of each year  
Date of priority of appropriation: \*April 29, 1960

Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is pumped from Lake Tahoe by the Burnt Cedar pump station via two 400 H.P. pumps (2,400 g.p.m. each, 3,950 g.p.m. combined) housed in WPS I and one 200 H.P. pump (1,100 g.p.m.) and one diesel backup pump (1,100 g.p.m.) housed in WPS IA, thence the water is conveyed to the distribution system for municipal purposes to serve 2,730 single family dwellings, 3,745 multiple family residential units, commercial users, snowmaking at Diamond Peak Ski Area and golf course irrigation all located within Sections 1, 2, 3, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23; W $\frac{1}{2}$ , W $\frac{1}{2}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and S $\frac{1}{2}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 24, S $\frac{1}{2}$  Section 8, W $\frac{1}{2}$  and W $\frac{1}{2}$  E $\frac{1}{2}$  Section 12, E $\frac{1}{2}$  Section 18, portions of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 19, and within the W $\frac{1}{2}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , E $\frac{1}{2}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , NE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 30, T.16N., R.18E., M.D.B.&M.


