CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Richard W. Arden, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from the Truckee River through an infiltration gallery, pump vault, pump and sprinkler system for as decreed purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

SW¼ NW¼ Section 23, T.20N., R.23E., M.D.M., or at a point from which the West ¼ corner of said Section 23 bears S. 62° 58' W., a distance of 647.5 feet situated in Storey County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: King Tolles
Source: Truckee River
Manner of Use: As decreed
Amount of appropriation: 0.025 c.f.s., but not to exceed 4.0 acre-feet annually
Period of use: As decreed
Date of priority of appropriation: *As decreed

Description of land to which the water is appurtenant:

1.0 acre in the SW¼ NW¼ Section 23, T.20N., R.23E., M.D.B.&M.

*This certificate changes the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of Truckee River Decree [Final Decree in United States v. Orr Water Ditch Co., In Equity Docket No. A-3 (D. Nevada 1944)] Claims #478 and 479. Therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Truckee River Decree Claims #478 and 479.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre as decreed.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
