CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

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WHEREAS, Gary E. Johnson, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and distribution system for commercial and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

NE¼ SE¼ of Section 11, T.12N., R.20E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the E¼ corner of said Section 11 bears N. 17° 16' 37" E., a distance of 1,038.34 feet situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Sacramento District Church of the Nazarene Advisory Board

Source: Underground

Manner of Use: Commercial and Domestic

Amount of appropriation: 0.027 c.f.s., but not to exceed 0.14 million gallons annually

Period of use: January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: *July 17, 1992

Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is developed by means of a drilled well, 200 feet deep, 6 inch diameter casing, equipped with a submersible pump, thence through a distribution system to a church, located within the SE¼ NE¼ SE¼ of Section 11, T.12N., R.20E., M.D.B.&M., for commercial and domestic purposes.

*The date of priority was established in accordance with NRS 533.395(3) by the cancellation rescission hearing of September 27, 1993.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
