**CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER**

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WHEREAS, Robert C. Joslin, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Dee Bee Spring through a hand dug basin for Wildlife purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 5, T.19S., R.56E., M.D.B.&M.  
or at a point from which the NE corner of  
Tract 41 in said Section 5 bears S. 28° E., a  
distance of 700.0 feet situated in Clark  
County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator:	United States of America Forest Service
Source:	Dee Bee Spring
Manner of Use:	Wildlife
Amount of appropriation:	0.001 c.f.s., or sufficient to water 25 head of deer
Period of use:	January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation:	May 29, 1990

**Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:**

Water from Dee Bee Spring is impounded in a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  foot by 3 foot hand dug basin where 25 deer and a variety of small mammals and birds water, located within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 5, T.19S., R.56E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
