CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Dennis Brazzanovich, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from the West Fork Carson River for decreed purposes The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows.

Tucke or Wyatt Dressler Ditch from right bank by the same diversion dam as the Company Ditch in NW¼ NE¼ Section 5, T.11N., R 20E., M.D B &M. situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows

0.41 acres in the SW¼ SE¼ of Section 32, T 12N., R 20E., M.D.B &M


***This certificate changes the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of Claim 566, Carson River Final Decree in United States v Alpine Land & Reservoir Co., Civil No. D-183 BRT (D. Nevada 1980), therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Claim 566.**

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed as decreed acre-feet per acre per season as decreed from any and/or all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
