CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Bruce L. Rice, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Little Echo Canyon Spring, an improved spring through a drill hole and catch basin for stockwater purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

SE¼ SW¼ Section 18, T.3N., R.52E., M.D.B.&M. (unsurveyed), or at a point from which the SW corner of Section 19, T.3N., R.52E., M.D.B.&M., bears S. 17°55'00" W., a distance of 6,120.0 feet situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Joe B. Fallini, Jr., Helen L. Fallini, and Susan L. Fallini
Source: Little Echo Canyon Spring
Manner of Use: Stockwater
Amount of appropriation: 0.032 c.f.s., or sufficient to water 1,000 head of cattle and 25 horses
Period of use: January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: February 23, 1982

Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is diverted from an improved spring via a 25 feet drilled hole and a catch basin, where 1,000 head of cattle and 25 horses water within the SE¼ SW¼ of Section 18, T.3N., R.52E., M.D.B.&M., unsurveyed, being within the Reveille Allotment.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
