CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

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WHEREAS, John C. Jamrog, Agent, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Salt Spring, for wildlife purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

SW¼ NE¼ NE¼ Section 19, T.17S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the NW corner of said Section 19, bears N. 75°57'00" W., a distance of 4,136.0 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Source: Salt Spring

Manner of Use: Wildlife

Amount of appropriation: 0.0003 c.f.s., or sufficient to water
50 Bighorn sheep

Period of use: January 1st to December 31st
of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: March 15, 1994

Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is diverted from an unimproved spring through a natural channel to an eight-acre fenced area where 50 Bighorn sheep water within SW¼ NE¼ NE¼ Section 19, T.17S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
