CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Robert J. Edwards, Agent, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada, Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Knott Creek and Tributaries, for wildlife purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

NW¼ SE¼ Section 17, T.43N., R.28E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the E¼ corner of said Section 17 bears N. 81° 10' E., a distance of 1,389 feet situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada

Under the provisions of NRS 533.425, the State Engineer has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator:	United States of America, Department of Interior, Bureau of Land Management
Source:	Knott Creek and Tributaries
Manner of use:	Wildlife
Amount of appropriation:	0.0014 c.f.s., but not to exceed 0.50 acre-feet annually.
Period of use:	January 1 st to December 31 st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation:	*February 17, 1982

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water flowing in the natural channels of Knott Creek and Tributaries is utilized by 22 Bighorn Sheep, 112 Pronghorn Antelope, and 97 Mule Deer for wildlife purposes within portions of Section 8, T.43N., R.28E. M.D.B.&M.

*This certificate changes the manner and place of use of a portion of Permit 49042, which changed the point of diversion, manner and place of use of a portion of Permit 45340; therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Permit 45340.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.
