## CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Lee Niel Allen, Agent, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada, Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from the Walker River through the Campbell Ditch, West Campbell Ditch and distribution system for as decreed purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

**Campbell Ditch**

NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 15, T.13N., R.25E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the NW corner of said Section 15 bears N. 34°12'57" W. a distance of 1,385.06 feet situated in Lyon County, State of Nevada.

Under the provisions of NRS 533.425, the State Engineer has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Source:	Walker River
Manner of use:	As Decreed
Amount of appropriation:	0.415 c.f.s., but not to exceed 34.50 acres of irrigation as decreed
Period of use:	As Decreed
Date of priority of appropriation:	*As Decreed

**Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:**


Water is diverted from the Walker River through the Campbell Ditch into the West Campbell ditch and through a distribution system for flood irrigation of 34.50 acres of oats located within a portion of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 18, T.14N., R.25E., M.D.B.&M.

\*This certificate changes the place of use of a portion of the claim under Rosachi, Ambro, Successor to Pacific Livestock Company, which is Claim 132 at page 40, of the Walker River Final Decree, in United States v. Walker River Irrigation District in Equity, Docket No. C-125 (D. Nevada 1936), therefore, the date of priority remains the same as the claim under Rosachi, Ambro, Successor to Pacific Livestock Company, which is Claim 132 at page 40.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit, and with the understanding that the total duty of water is as decreed, and subject to the continuing jurisdiction of the Federal Water Master.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
