

STATE OF NEVADA**CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER**

WHEREAS, Michael D. Buschelman, Agent, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada, Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Pearson Spring for wildlife purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

NE¹/₄ SE¹/₄ Section 34, T.19S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of Section 6, T.17S., R.69E., M.D.B.&M., bears N. 29°29' W., a distance of 100,759 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Under the provisions of NRS 533.425, the State Engineer has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Source:	Pearson Spring
Manner of use:	Wildlife
Amount of appropriation:	0.00074 c.f.s., but not to exceed 0.18 acre-feet annually
Period of use:	January 1st through December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation:	*1900

Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:


The discharge from Pearson Spring flows in the natural channel for wildlife and riparian habitat preservation within the NE¹/₄ SE¹/₄ Section 34, T.19S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M.

***This certificate changes the manner of use of Proof V02344; therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Proof V02344.**

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and specifically subject to the terms of any order in the matter of determination of the relative rights in and to the waters of Pearson Spring.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
