CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Michael D. Buschelman, Agent, has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada, Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Red Rock Spring No. 2 for wildlife purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows:

NW¼ NE¼ Section 18, T.17S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE corner of Section 6, T.17S., R.69E., M.D.B.&M., bears N. 78°02' W., a distance of 30,925 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Under the provisions of NRS 533.425, the State Engineer has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator:	Clark County
Source:	Red Rock Spring No. 2
Manner of use:	Wildlife
Amount of appropriation:	0.01 c.f.s., but not to exceed 6.72 acre-feet annually
Period of use:	January 1st through December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation:	*January 23, 1930


Description of the works of diversion, manner and place of use:

The discharge from Red Rock Spring No. 2 flows in the natural channel for wildlife and riparian habitat preservation within the NW¼ NE¼ Section 18, T.17S., R.70E., M.D.B.&M.

***This certificate changes the manner of use of Permit 9211, Certificate 2178; therefore, the date of priority remains the same as Permit 9211, Certificate 2178.**

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
