CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Chester L. Woodward has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Columbia Creek (Flood Water) through ditches for Irrigation

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: in the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 2, Township 43 N., Range 52 E., M.D.B.& M., or at a point from which the S.W. Corner of said Section 2 bears S. 38° 10' W., 6,192 feet, situated in Elko County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

\* Amount of appropriation. 0.72 c.f.s. or 174 acre-feet for the period  
Period of use, from April 1st to July 31st of each year  
Date of priority of appropriation. June 13, 1928

Description of lands to which water is appurtenant:-  
6.85 acres in the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 11, Township 43 N., Range 52 E., M.D.B.&M.  
26.01 acres in the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 11, Township 43 N., Range 52 E., M.D.B.&M.  
39.18 acres in the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 11, Township 43 N., Range 52 E., M.D.B.&M.  
72.04 acres total

\*NOTE:- This certificate is issued subject to the terms in that certain Memorandum of Agreement between Petan Land & Cattle Company and Chester L. Woodward dated February 23rd, 1940, and of record in the Nevada State Engineer's Office.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
