The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 26, T. 35 N., R. 29 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SW corner of Section 34, T. 35 N., R. 29 E., M.D.M. bears S 40° - 40' W., 10,625.20 feet, or at a point from which the S 1/4 Corner of Section 35, T. 35 N., R. 29 E., bears S 78° 07' E., 8,075.7' situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.
