CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Kenneth Gubler, Farmer has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source

through Lund ditch from Preston Big Spring for Irrigation

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 29, T. 12 N., R. 62 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE Corner of Section 33, T. 12 N., R. 62 E., M.D.M., bears S. 43° 21'E., 14,811.00 feet. situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937

has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation: 0.7791 c.f.s. or not to exceed 311.64 acre-feet per season.

Period of use, from April 1 to November 30 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: June 16, 1945
