

THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Joe Scuffe has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Northumberland Springs through dam and ditches for Irrigation purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE¹ SE¹ Section 8, T. 12 N., R. 16 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SE Corner of said 8, bears S. 6° 08' E. 2,313.7 feet situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Warren C. Hunt and Ethelyn Leona Hunt, his wife, and Donald B. Hunt and Esther Cecielia Hunt, his wife, as joint tenants with the right of survivorship.
Post-office address Tonopah, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.124 c.f.s. or 60.15 acre feet per season

Period of use, from March 1 to October 31 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation June 15, 1915

Description of land to which water is appurtenant:
12.40 acres in the NW¹ SW¹ Section 9, T. 12 N., R. 16 E., M.D.B.&M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
