CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Robert F. Guinn, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Lake Tahoe through pump, pipeline and pressure system for Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 27, T. 14 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point that bears S. 21° 47' W., 1,644 feet from the meander corner common to Sections 22 & 27, T. 14 N., R. 18 E. situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation November 25, 1949

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Approximately 300 feet of 2 1/2 inch intake pipe leading from Lake Tahoe to an electrically driven pump and pressure system; thence through 700 feet of 2 1/2 inch pipe to branch lines leading to dwelling, yard, house and fire hydrants located in the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 27, T. 14 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M.

- The amount of water to be pumped shall not exceed 500 gallons per day between June 1 and September 15 of each year.
The intermittent use during the period from September 16 to May 31 of the following year shall not exceed 50 gallons per capita per day.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
