CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Ira Carter has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source (Las Vegas Artesian Basin) through well, pipe line, tank & pressure system. for Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 28, T. 21 S., R. 62 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the E 1/4 corner of said Section 28, bears N. 87° 10' E., 2,021.00 feet, situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is developed by means of a drilled well 480 feet deep and cased with 100 feet of 6 inch casing. Equipped with a 1 inch shut-off valve and a meter, the water is then conveyed through 2,000 feet of 1 inch pipe to a 1,000 gallon storage tank located near the house. Water comes from the well to the storage tank by gravity. A Fairbanks pressure system pumps the water from the storage tank into the pipe lines serving the house, chicken pens and yard located in the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 28, T. 21 S., R. 62 E., M.D.B.&M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
