

THE STATE OF NEVADA
CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Howard B. Cahoon, Owner has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source (Las Vegas Artesian Basin) through well, pump, tank and pipelines for Domestic purposes.

The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 9, T. 21 S., R. 61 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SW Section corner of said Section 9, bears S. 46° 24' W., 1,243.00 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: September 25, 1947

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is developed by means of a drilled well 120 feet deep and cased with 93 feet of 8 inch casing. Equipped with a 1 1/2 H.P. jet type pump that discharges the water into a 600 gallon pressure tank; thence by 120 feet of 3/4 inch and 300 feet of 1/2 inch pipe to rest room, snack bar, and coolers for the operation of an open air theatre, all located within the N 1/2 SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 9, T. 21 S., R. 61 E., M.D.B.&M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
