**THE STATE OF NEVADA
CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER**

WHEREAS, H. L. Titus, Rancher has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground (Well No. 1) through well, pump, pipeline and troughs for Stockwatering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 29, T. 9 N., R. 56 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SW corner of Sec. 31, T. 9 N., R. 56 E., M.D.M. bears S. 51° 33' W., 13,124 feet situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Madison Locke & H. L. Titus

Post-office address Tonopah, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.001 c.f.s. or sufficient to water 150 head of cattle

Period of use, from November 1 to April 1 the following of each year

Date of priority of appropriation July 24, 1947

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
The water is developed by means of a drilled well 75 feet deep equipped with a gasoline driven pump. The water is conveyed through 20 feet of 2 inch pipe into 30 feet of troughs, all located in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 29, T. 9 N., R. 56 E., M.D.B.&M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
