CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, C. V. Taylor, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground through wells and ditches for Irrigation and Domestic purposes.

The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 11, T. 37 N., R. 25 E., M.D.B.&M., or at points from which the SE cor. of said Sec. 11 bears S. 49° 09' E., 2,301' and S. 45° 07' E., 2,345', situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: April 26, 1948

129.76 acres total.

The water is developed by means of 3 artesian wells. The west well is 200 feet deep with 4 inch casing. The north well consists of two combined wells, one 90 feet deep and the other 150 feet deep, both with 4 inch casing. Water is carried to the land to be irrigated by means of ditches.

*NOTE: Not to exceed a yearly duty of 4 acre-feet per acre irrigated from all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
