CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, A. Challstrom, Ass't. Secretary has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground

through well, pumps, tanks and pipeline for Mining and Milling

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 30, T. 13 N., R. 33 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the NW corner of said Sec. 30 bears N. 42° 00' W., 2,106 feet

situated in Mineral County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source,

purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Nevada Scheelite Inc.

Post-office address 545 1/2 South Taylor Street, Fallon, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.28 c.f.s.

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation November 19, 1947

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is developed by means of a drilled well 250 feet deep equipped with a 125 g.p.m. pump driven by a 50 H.P. motor. The water is conveyed to the mine storage tank by means of approximately 17,000 feet of 4 inch pipe. There are three booster pump stations along this line, each equipped with a tank 20 feet in diameter and 8 feet deep. The place of use is within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 and NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 12, T. 13 N., R. 32 E., M.D.B.&M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
