CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Harry D. Willis, General Engineer has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Rhyolite Spring through pipeline and troughs for Wildlife Watering

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 21, T. 45 N., R. 25 E., M.D.B.&M., unsurveyed, or at a point from which the SE corner of Sec. 24, T. 45 N., R. 24 E., bears N. 89°45' W., 13,926 feet situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source,

purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: United States of America, Fish and Wildlife Service
Post-office address: Swan Island, Portland 18, Oregon
Amount of appropriation: 0.00013 c.f.s.
Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: December 1, 1949

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is conveyed from spring to two galvanized troughs, 2 feet by 4 feet by 8 feet, by means of 40 feet of 1 1/2 inch pipe. The place of use is at the troughs in the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
