

THE STATE OF NEVADA
CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS G. M. Reid has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground through well, windmill, tank, pipeline and troughs for Stockwatering and Domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 28, T. 12 N., R. 62 E., M.D.B. & M. or at a point from which the SE corner of said Sec. 28 bears S. 87° 20' E., 1,695 feet situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator G. M. Reid
Post-office address Lund, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 0.003 c.f.s. or sufficient to water 30 cattle, 75 pigs and 300 sheep
Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation July 5, 1950

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is developed by means of a dug well 5 feet square and 45 feet deep concreted 12 feet down and equipped with a 27 foot windmill tower with an 8 foot aermotor wheel; thence conveyed through 570 feet of 2 inch pipeline to two sets of troughs in the corral, to the house for domestic purposes and to a galvanized storage tank of 1500 gallon capacity. The place of use is within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
