CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Irene Butzer Snader has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Kyle Spring through storage tanks and pipelines for Domestic purposes.

The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 36, T. 19 S., R. 56 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the N 1/2 corner of said Sec. 36 bears N. 27° 04' 10" E., 303.1 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Irene M. Butzer

Amount of appropriation: 0.03 c.f.s.
Period of use, from: January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: July 27, 1950

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is diverted from Kyle Spring into two 12,000 gallon storage tanks; thence conveyed to the place of use through one-half mile of 4 inch pipeline; thence distributed to about 30 cabins and a public lodge through smaller pipelines. The place of use is within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4, NW 1/4 NE 1/4 and NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 36, T. 19 S., R. 56 E., M.D.M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
