CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Ray Thomas has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground (Well No. 7) through well, pump and ditches for Irrigation

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Sec. 24, T. 20 S., R. 53 E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the W 1/2 corner of said Sec. 24 Bears N. 42° 20' W., 3,227 feet.

situated in Nye County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of -1937- has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation: 3.0 Cfs., not to exceed a yearly duty of 659.6 A. F.
Period of use, from March 1 to November 15 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: September 18, 1943

Description of land to which water is appurtenant:

Table with 10 columns: Area, and 9 columns for section/corner descriptions. Includes rows for 6.71 acres total and specific section descriptions like NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Sec. 23, etc.

NOTE: The waters under this Certificate are comingled with the waters under other Certificates and Permits. The total duty of water from all sources, however, shall not exceed a yearly duty of 5.0 acre-feet per acre.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
