CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, P. K. Christman has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from

Unnamed Spring tank through diversion dam, pipeline & Pressure/ for Commercial Fish Rearing and Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the NW 1/4 Sec. 12, T. 18 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the E 1/2 corner of said Sec. 12 bears N. 67° 49' E., 2,062.3 feet. situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator P. K. Christman (Xman Trout Ranch)

Post-office address P. O. Box 2308, Reno, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.222 cfs.

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation January 8, 1949

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is diverted from the source by means of an earth dam; thence conveyed to the main building through 350 feet of 6 inch pipeline. The place of use is within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

Note: This Certificate is issued subject to that certain ruling of the State Engineer dated June 8, 1951, "In the Matter of Applications Nos. 12791 and 12792 in the name of P. K. Christman".

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
