

THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER


WHEREAS, Hannah E. Bathurst has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground through well, pump, pipeline and storage tank for Quasi-municipal and Domestic

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows Within the NE¹/₄ NW¹/₄ Sec. 16, T. 20 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the NE¹/₄ corner of said Sec. 16 bears N. 29° 49' E., 1,444 feet situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 0.022 c.f.s.
Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
Date of priority of appropriation May 18, 1949

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is developed by means of a drilled well 209 feet deep cased with 6 inch casing and equipped with a 2 H.P. Berkeley pump and a 120 gallon storage tank; thence conveyed through about 400 feet of 2-inch mains to 7 houses. The place of use is within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.



The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
