CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Joe Capurro has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Snake Creek through diversion dam and ditches for Irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Sec. 20, T. 26 N., R. 20 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the N 1/4 corner of said sec. 20 bears N. 9° 59' E., 4,856 feet, situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

14.40 acres in the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Sec. 20, T. 26 N., R. 20 E., M.D.B.&M.
3.63 acres in the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Sec. 20, T. 26 N., R. 20 E., M.D.B.&M.
50.33 acres total

\* NOTE: Not to exceed a yearly duty of 4 acre-feet per acre of land irrigated or a total duty of 201.32 acre-feet per season.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
