

# THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, C. D. "Roy" Long has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through well, pump, pressure tank & pipelines for quasi-municipal & domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the NW 1/4 Section 13, T. 20 S., R. 60 E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the SE corner of said section 13, bears S. 11° 17' W., 1,635.0 feet. situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

 Amount of appropriation 0.05 c.f.s. not to exceed 1.5 M.G. per annum.  
 Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year  
 Date of priority of appropriation October 4, 1951

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:  
Water is developed by means of a drilled well 234 feet deep cased the entire depth with 8 inch casing and equipped with a 3 H.P. pump and pressure tank. Water is conveyed through 950 feet of 2 inch pipe to 3 sprinklersystems, two large dwellings, and extensive lawns, trees, and shrubs. The place of use is within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
