CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, George Whittell has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Marlette Creek (North Fork and Springs) through dam, pipeline and power plant for power and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 11, T. 15 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the S 1/4 corner of said Section 11, bears S. 43° 06' W., 2194.88 feet. situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: George Whittell
Post-office address: Crystal Bay, Nevada
Amount of appropriation: 0.25 c.f.s.
Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: November 15, 1947

Description of place and manner of use:
By means of an earth dam, the water is diverted from the North Fork of Marlette Creek into a ditch, which conveys the water in a southeasterly direction approximately 200 feet to Marlette Creek where it is comingled with the waters thereof under Permit No. 12086. The waters from these two creeks are impounded in a reservoir which was completed prior to September 1938. The reservoir is approximately 1,000 feet long and 453 feet wide at the dam which is approximately 25' high with a four feet wide by 3 feet high concrete spillway at the southerly end. This dam is situated a short distance above the confluence of North Fork of Marlette Creek. Marlette Creek impounds all of the waters from both creeks by means of a 6" pipe. The comingled waters are conveyed in a southwesterly direction 1,789 feet to the junction with a 4 inch pipe line from the South Fork of Marlette Creek (Permit No. 12087). The comingled waters from these three creeks covered by Permits Nos. 12085-North Fork Marlette Creek; 12086-Marlette Creek, and 12087-South Fork Marlette Creek, are conveyed from the above junction point by means of a six inch pipe in a northwesterly direction 2,280 feet to the power plant in Lot 4, Section 11, T. 15 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M., where the water is used to generate power by means of a 10 H.P. Pelton wheel situated 200 feet below the intake pipe from the above described reservoir. Water is also used for fish pond and for general domestic purposes at dwellings. Power is used in dwellings, outer buildings, and for outside lighting.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
