CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Salvatore Pipitone has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Underground (Las Vegas Artesian Basin) through well, pump, tank & pipeline for quasi-municipal purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 21, T. 21 S., R. 61 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the W 1/4 corner of said Section 21, bears N. 20° 37' W., 889.6 feet. situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 46, Statutes of 1937 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Raymond V. Jones and Lanore E. Jones
Post-office address: 3927 South 5th Street, Las Vegas, Nevada
Amount of appropriation: 0.10 c.f.s., not to exceed 4.0 m.g. per annum.
Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: May 14, 1952

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is developed by means of a drilled well 432 feet deep cased with 100 feet of 8 inch and 340 feet of 6 inch casing, and equipped with a 5 H.P. deep well turbine pump, and a 5000 gallon storage tank; thence conveyed to the 42-unit motel through 2 inch pipeline. The place of use is within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
