CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Brice McBride has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Ten Mile Springs through pipe and trough for stockwatering and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 35, T. 43 N., R. 24 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the N.E. corner of said Section 35, bears N. 53° 30' E., 1,140 feet. situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of Section 72, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: United States of America, Fish and Wildlife Service

Post-office address: Portland, Oregon

Amount of appropriation: .015 c.f.s., or sufficient water to water 500 animals.

Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: October 18, 1919

Description of place and manner of use:

Water is diverted from the spring into a pipeline and conveyed to a trough where it is used for stockwatering (horses, antelope, etc.) purposes within the same subdivision as the point of diversion.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
