CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Don Early has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through well, pump, pipelines and ditches for irrigation purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 15, T. 14 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B.&M. or at a point from which the S.W. corner of said Section bears S. 5° 40' W., a distance of 3,054 feet, situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS. 533.425; has determined the date, source, purpose and amount of such appropriation, together with the place to which such water is appurtenant, as follows:

* All or portions of the lands under this certificate are also irrigated with water from other sources and the total duty of water from all sources shall not exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre per season.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place where acquired and to the purpose for which acquired.
