CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Will M. Bliss, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Lake Tahoe through pump, pressure tanks and pipelines for domestic (subdivision, 11 homesites) purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Lot 1 (NE 1/4 NW 1/4) Extended Sec. 10, T. 14 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the meander corner of Secs. 3 and 10, T. 14 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M. bears N. 76° 45' E., 520 feet situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: The Glenbrook Company
Post-office address: Glenbrook, Nevada

\* Amount of appropriation: 0.01 c.f.s., not to exceed 6,500 gallons per day, between June 1st and September 15th of each year.
Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation: July 1, 1947

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is diverted by means of a pump, pressure tanks and a system of pipelines, water is conveyed to the places of use located in portions of Lot 4 (SE 1/4 SW 1/4), Lot 5 (SW 1/4 SE 1/4) and SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 3 and portions of Lot 1 (NW 1/4 NE 1/4) and NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 10, T. 14 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M.

\* Intermittent use between September 16th and May 31st of the following year shall not exceed 50 gallons per day per capita.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
