

To change place of use of portions of Claim Nos. 568 & 568-A of The Truckee River Final Decree

THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Edward C. Reed, agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from The Truckee River through North Truckee Ditch for irrigation, stock watering and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 7, T. 19 N., R. 20 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the N.E. corner of said Sec. 7 bears N. 34° 51' E., 3,103 feet. situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

* Amount of appropriation 0.945 c.f.s., but not to exceed 206 ac.ft. annually

Period of use, from As Decreed of each year

January 29, 1865 (Claim No. 568)

Date of priority of appropriation September 3, 1887 (Claim No. 568-A)

Description of land to which water is appurtenant:

Table with 2 columns: Area (acres) and Land Description. Includes entries like '27.1 acres in NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 2, T. 19 N., R. 20 E., M.D.B.&M.' and a total of 262.5 acres.

* Irrigated lands listed above are also irrigated under Claim Nos. 574 & 575 of The Truckee River Final Decree, therefore the total duty from all sources shall not exceed 4.0 acre feet per acre annually.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
