CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, James Solomon has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Oak Creek Springs through dyke, pump, pipeline and tank for mining and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 21, T. 21 S., R. 58 E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the S.E. corner of Sec. 22, T. 21 S., R. 58 E., M.D.B.&M., bears S. 86° 00' E., 7,575 feet situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator James Solomon

Post-office address Las Vegas, Nevada

Amount of appropriation 0.02 c.f.s.

Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year

Date of priority of appropriation February 3, 1955

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: Water is pumped from a small holding pond at the spring site and conveyed to a tank via 2" pipeline. The water is used for mining and domestic purposes within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 21 and the SW 1/4 Section 22, T. 21 S., R. 58 E., M.D.B.&M.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
