CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Mark Chilton-Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through well, pump, and irrigation system for irrigation purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: Lot 1 (SW 1/4 SW 1/4) Sec. 35, T. 21N., R. 53E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the W. quarter-corner of said Section 35, bears N. 42° 08' W., a distance of 1,919.48 feet. situated in Eureka County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

*This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit with the understanding that the total duty of water for the land shall not exceed 4.0 ac. ft. per acre annually from all sources.

**This certificate changes the point of diversion under Permit 18713, hence the date of priority is the same as 18713.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
