CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS James N. Nelson-Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through underground collection box pump storage tanks and distribution system for quasi-municipal and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 19, T. 17N., R. 19E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the NE 1/4 corner of said Section 19 bears N. 4° 10' 09" W., a distance of 2,925.33 ft. situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator Mt. Rose Development Co.
Post-office address Castro Valley, California
Amount of appropriation 0.20 c.f.s. but not to exceed 1.57 mg. per annum
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation August 3, 1960

Description of works of diversion, manner, and place of use:
Water is collected in an underground collection box, thence pumped to a 10,000 gallon storage tank, from which it either enters the distribution system or is pumped to a 100,000 gallon tank; whence it enters the distribution system to be used for quasi-municipal and domestic purposes within a portion of the NE 1/4 of Section 19, T. 17N., R. 19E., M.D.B. & M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
