CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Alvin Billingsley has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through well, pump, and distribution system for quasi-municipal (subdivision) and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 4, T. 16 N., R. 22 E., M.D.B.&M.; or at a point from which the SE corner of said Section 4 bears S. 63° 19' 15" E., a distance of 3,014.15 feet. situated in Lyon County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Name of appropriator: Alvin B. and Enid Billingsley
Post-office address: Dayton, Nevada
* Amount of appropriation: 0.23 cfs but not to exceed 7.39 mg annually
Period of use, from: January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation: April 6, 1961

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use: water is developed by means of a drilled well and is conveyed through a distribution system consisting of 4" mains and 2" laterals to 14 homes on 5 acre plots which are located within the SE 1/4, S 1/2 SW 1/4 Section 4, and Section 9, T. 16 N., R. 22 E., M.D.B.&M., and there used for quasi-municipal (subdivision) and domestic purposes.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
