CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Wallace T. Boundy (Agent) has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Cordano Mountain Spring No. 1 through Indian Creek Channel & Irrigation System for Irrigation

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 25, T. 26 N., R. 63 E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the NE corner of Section 5, T. 25 N., R. 64 E., M.D.B. & M., bears S. 63° 26' 30" E., a distance of 22,698.0 feet. situated in White Pine County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre per season from all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
