CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS Robert G. Ballance (Agent) has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through drilled well, pump and distribution system for quasi-municipal

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: at a point that bears N. 84° 43' 36" W. a distance of 534.20 feet from the SE 1/4 of U. S. Gov't. Tract No. 43, T.16S., R.56E., M.D.B.&M. situated in Clark County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

* Amount of appropriation 0.1 c.f.s. but not to exceed 23.57 M.G. per annum

Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year

Date of priority of appropriation August 8, 1962

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:

Water is drawn by 100 H.P. motor from 580 ft. well and distributed through 1275 ft. of 10 inch, 5340.0 ft. of 8 inch, and 2542 ft. of 6 inch pipe to serve 135 single family dwellings, 2 churches, 1 school (440 pupils), 2 service stations, 1 laundrymat, 1 bar and 1 beauty parlor, all located within U. S. Gov't. Tracts 43-A, 43-B, 43-C and 43-D, T. 16 S., R. 56 E., M.D.B.&M.

*This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
