CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, E. P. Osgood, Jr. (Agent) has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through drilled well, pump and ditches for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Sec. 36, T.21N., R.34E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the S 1/4 corner of said Sec. 36 bears S. 87° 05' W. a distance of 1,242.0 feet. situated in Churchill County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Description of land to which water is appurtenant:

Table with 4 columns: Area, Section, Township, Range. Rows include 40.0 acres in the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 36, T.21N., R.34E., M.D.B.&M., and sub-sections NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SW 1/4 SE 1/4, NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SE 1/4 SE 1/4. Total 103.54 acres.

*This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed 4.0 acre feet per acre annually from all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
