CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Eugene Scossa has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Miller Creek through Diversion box, pipeline and ditches for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 26, T.12N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the NW corner of said Sec. 26 bears N. 65° 10' W., a distance of 1069.01 feet situated in Douglas County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 1.07 c.f.s. but not to exceed 684.8 acre feet annually
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation July 1, 1968

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water for the land under this certificate shall not exceed 4.0 acre feet per acre annually from any and/or all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
