CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Alicia Beck has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through drilled well, pump and troughs for stock watering and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 10, T.15N., R.20E., M.D.B.&M. or at a point from which the NW corner of said Sec. 10 bears N. 82° 12' 24" W. a distance of 2,361.28 feet situated in Carson City County, State of Nevada.

NOW KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 0.0027 c.f.s. or sufficient to water 50 head of cattle and 200 goats  
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year  
\* Date of priority of appropriation August 2, 1968

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:  
Water is pumped from the well through pipeline to 20 troughs located within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 10, T.15N., R.20E., M.D.B.&M. where it is used for watering 50 head of cattle and 200 goats.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

\*This certificate changes the manner of use of a portion of Permit 24619 hence the priority of appropriation is the same as Permit 24619

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
