CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, James G. Sanders, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through drilled well, pump and irrigation system for irrigation

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Sec. 24, T.45N., R.33E., M.D.B.&M. or at a point from which the W 1/4 corner of said Sec. 24 bears S. 32° 18' W. a distance of 366.03 feet situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

*This certificate changes the point of diversion of Permit 16391 hence the priority is the same as Permit 16391.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water for the land under this certificate shall not exceed 4.0 acre feet per acre per season from any and/or all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
