CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Joe Heguy, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from Mason Creek through ditches for irrigation purposes.

The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 33, T.43N., R.57E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SW corner of said Sec. 33 bears S. 60° 05' W. a distance of 4,080.0 feet situated in Elko County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Post-office address Elko, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 0.08 c.f.s. but not to exceed 14.44 acre feet per season
Period of use, from April 15th to July 15th of each year

* Date of priority of appropriation June 28, 1911

Description of land to which the water is appurtenant:

- 1.0 acre in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T.43N., R.57E., M.D.B.&M.
- 4.09 acres in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T.43N., R.57E., M.D.B.&M.
- 5.09 acres total

*This certificate changes the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of Permit 2125 hence the priority of appropriation is the same as Permit 2125.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty allowed shall not exceed 4.0 acre-feet per acre per season from any and/or all sources.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein
