CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, R. T. Forest, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and trucks for geothermal tests purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 NE 1/4 Sec. 35, T. 22N., R. 26E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the northeast corner of Sec. 36, T. 22N., R. 26E., M.D.B. & M. bears N. 84°48'E., a distance of 6,435.2 feet situated in Churchill County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 0.1 c.f.s., but not to exceed 1.0 M.G.A.
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation April 4, 1974

Description of works of diversion, place and manner of use:
Water is pumped from an 8' x 10' dug well about 15 feet deep by a portable gasoline pump into trucks; thence hauled by truck to the places of use located in T. 21N., R. 26E.; T. 21N., R. 27E.; T. 21N., R. 28E.; T. 22N., R. 26E.; T. 22N., R. 27E.; T. 22N., R. 28E.; T. 23N., R. 26E.; T. 23N., R. 27E.; and T. 23N., R. 28E., M.D.B. & M., and there used for drill water for drilling geothermal test holes.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
