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THE STATE OF NEVADA CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Calmer J. Johnson, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and irrigation system for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 3, T.11N., R.33E., M.D.B.&M or at a point from which the SE corner of said Section 3 bears S 22°26'45"E, a distance of 69.13 feet situated in Mineral County, State of Nevada.

Now Know YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533 425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows.
