CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, A. J. Evans, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and distribution system fire protection and standby

purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 31, T.36N., R.38E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the NW corner of said Section 31 bears N. 12° 49' E., a distance of 3685.0 feet situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

Now Know Ye, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 2.0 c.f.s., not to exceed 0.512 m.g.a.
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation October 5, 1977

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is developed by means of a drilled well, pump and motor and conveyed through a distribution system to a potato washing plant located in the S 1/2 NW 1/4, N 1/2 SW 1/4, SE 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 31, T.36N., R.38E., M.D.B. & M., where it is used for fire protection and standby purposes (potato washing).

The total combined amount of water allowed under this certificate and Certificate 8908 issued under Permit 26633, shall not exceed 64.17 m.g.a.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
