CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Robert N. Caldwell, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and irrigation system for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 8, T. 25N., R. 42E., M.D.B. & M., or at a point from which the North 1/4 corner of said Section 8 bears N. 45° 19' 50" W., a distance of 3,694.40 feet situated in Lander County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Amount of appropriation 4.7 c.f.s., not to exceed 1108.79 acre/feet per year
Period of use, from January 1 to December 31 of each year
\* Date of priority of appropriation July 8, 1974

Description of land to which the water is appurtenant

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit and with the understanding that the total duty of water shall not exceed 4.0 acre/feet per acre per annum from any and/or all sources.

This certificate is supplemental to Permit 30764 for 588.51 acres and a total duty not to exceed 2,354.04 acre/feet per year from both sources.

\* This certificate changes the place of use of Permit No. 28472; therefore the date of priority remains the same as Permit No. 28472.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
